

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Support of Community Health Representative Funding)

RES. NO. 189-85

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has been advised of proposed FY 86 funding re-
2 ductions, freezes and/or termination in many federal programs,
3 including the Community Health Representative (CHR) program under the
4 Indian Health Services; and


5 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has on previous occasions supported and urged the
6 continued funding of the CHR program for varied reasons including the
7 significance of the CHR program in providing services in areas of
8 mental health, elderly care, nutrition, alcoholism, environmental
9 health and disease control because of the readily availability of
10 CHR workers in remote areas of the Papago Reservation;

11 WHEREAS, The termination of funding for the CHR program will adversely impact
12 the Papago Tribe in an economic sense and curtail a much needed
13 practice of preventive health care carried on by the CHR workers;

14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
15 strongly oppose the proposed termination of funding for the CHR
16 program and urges the Honorable Congress to restore funding at a
17 minimum to the FY 85 level but preferably to increase the funding
18 level to a more realistic amount taking into consideration the unique
19 and special needs of individual tribes.

20 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 20th
21 day of March, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
22 1440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 03 absent, pursuant to the
23 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d), (f), and (h) of Article
24 V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
25 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary
26 of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June
27 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the
28 Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by
29 the Papago Council.
