

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Support for Continuation of Certain Federal Programs)

RES. NO. 193-85

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has learned of program changes and/or reductions
2 in many federal programs being proposed by President Reagan in his
3 FY 86 Budget, including:

- 4 - Reduction in funding for water projects including CAP
which will result in delay of delivery of water to Tucson
5 and San Xavier
- 6 - Reductions in college student aid programs
- 7 - Reductions in Headstart and child welfare funds
- 8 - Freeze on Women, Infants and Children nutrition programs
- 9 - Freeze on low income energy assistances
- 10 - Freeze on farm price supports/agricultural extension programs

11 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe directly and indirectly benefits from all of the
12 above programs;


13 WHEREAS, Freeze or reductions in funding will seriously affect and impact the
14 Papago Tribe and the delivery of services to eligible members of the
15 Tribe;

16 WHEREAS, No transition has been proposed by the Administration to compensate
17 for the disruption in services by the freezes or reductions;

18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
19 strongly oppose any reductions or freezes on funding for the above
20 listed programs and urges the Honorable Congress to scrutinize the
21 merits of the President's proposals taking into consideration the
22 devastating and serious impacts such as freezes and/or reductions
23 will have for the disadvantaged, poor, elderly, children and other
24 needy families of the Nation before accepting the proposals.

25 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 20th
26 day of March, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
27 1,440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 02 absent, pursuant to the
28 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d), (f) and (h) of Article
29 V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
30 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary
31 of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June
32 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the
Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by
the Papago Council.
