

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Papago Tribal Priority List FY 86)

RES. NO. 195-85

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has appointed a special delegation of Council
2 representatives to travel to Washington D.C. to testify before
3 appropriate Congressional committees on the President's FY 86 Budget;

4 WHEREAS, It is to the Tribe's advantage to prioritize the areas and programs
5 the Tribe will request Congress to consider in its appropriation
6 hearings; and

7 WHEREAS, This listing of programs is not exhaustive and is intended to aid
8 the Congress in considering the Papago Tribe's requests; and


9 WHEREAS, The first five programs are the top priority based on need and type
10 of services provided to the people;

11 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby list
12 the following programs in order of priority but that the first are
13 of top priority and that the Papago Council respectfully urges the
14 Congress to view these five as top priority for the Papago Tribe
15 and appropriate such funds as will bring all five programs to an
16 exemplary level of set funding.

- 17 1. Health
- 18 2. Education
- 19 3. Law Enforcement
- 20 4. Roads
- 21 5. Housing

22 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 20th
23 day of March, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
24 1,440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 02 absent, pursuant to the
25 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d), (f) and (h) of Article
26 V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
27 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secre-
28 tary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of
29 June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the
30 Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by
31 the Papago Council.
