

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Requesting transfer of Reservation telephone
facilities from BIA)

RES. NO. 197-85

1 WHEREAS, The BIA did by an Agreement dated October 4, 1960, sell to Mountain
2 States Telephone and Telegraph Company ("Mountain States") most of the
3 telephone lines and facilities then serving the Sells reservation; and
4 WHEREAS, Under the terms of said Agreement it was agreed that "certain desig-
5 nated stations and specified portions of the lines serving them",
6 including the lines and facilities serving the communities of Pisinemo
7 (connecting to the Sells-Ajo line) and San Miguel (connecting to the
8 Choulic line), would be excluded from the sale and would not "from a
9 part of the new Mountain States System ..."; and
10 WHEREAS, In order to obtain the consent of the Papago Council to the grant of
11 the necessary rights-of-way for the new Mountain States System, the
12 BIA agreed that it would "maintain the telephone lines to phones out-
13 side the proposed exchange area (including the lines to Pisinemo and
14 San Miguel) ... for a minimum period of two years from the date the
15 telephone compnay takes over the system which was set in the Agreement
16 as May 21, 1961." Resolution No. 1127; and
17 WHEREAS, Even though the telephone lines and faciiliites to the communities of
18 Pisinemo and San Miguel remain on the BIA inventory, the maintenance
19 and operation thereof has since the mid 1960's fallen upon the Papago
20 Tribe and its legal subdivisions, the districts and communities since,
21 after the sale of the system to Mountain States, it was against BIA
22 policy to provide public utility services and since the Agency was
23 without budget or funds to provide for the maintenance and operation
24 thereof; and
25 WHEREAS, The Papago Council did by Resolution No. 156-84 authorize and direct
26 the PTUA to apply for a loan from REA and, upon a determination by REA
27 that the loan is feasible, to enter into the loan and to construct,
28 operate and maintain telephone facilities on the reservation.
29 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council does hereby request the
30 BIA to transfer to the Papago Tribe all of the telephone lines and
31 facilities identified on the Papago Agency inventroy as serving the
32 communities of Pisinemo and San Miguel.

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Papago Council that once the PTUA has established
 2 telephone service to the communities of Pisinemo and San Miguel by
 3 means of its REA financed telephone facilities, the lines and facili-
 4 ties received by the Papago Tribe from the BIA pursuant to the
 5 foregoing request shall be abandoned in place.

6 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 10th
 7 day of April, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
 8 1440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and -0- absent, pursuant to the
 9 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 3 (h) of Article V of the
 10 Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago
 11 Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on
 12 January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.
 13 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the
 14 Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to review by the Secretary of
 15 the Interior.
