

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(FY-85 Head Start Grant-Cost of Living Allowance)

RES. NO. 205-85

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe has consistently supported the Head Start Program
2 providing comprehensive health, educational, nutritional, social and
3 other services to preschool children and their families; and

4 WHEREAS, The Head Start Program has been successfully operated through the
5 Early Childhood Head Start department and has served many young
6 Papago children; and

7 WHEREAS, The Papago Council is desirous of continuing this program for the
8 benefit of its young members; and

9 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has previously applied for, and received funding to
10 operate the Head Start program from the Department of Health and
11 Human Services, Head Start Bureau; and

12 WHEREAS, the Department of Health and Human Services has requested a proposal
13 for Cost-of-Living funding increases in the amount of \$19,537.00, to
14 help offset higher program operating costs due to inflations; and

15 WHEREAS, the Papago Council has reviewed the proposed application and finds
16 the same to be of benefit to the Head Start Program;


17 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
18 approve the proposed application for a 3.5% Cost-of-Living-Allowance
19 to supplement the Head Start Program; and

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Papago Council that Josiah Moore, Chairman,
21 Francisco Jose, Vice-Chairman or Rosita N. Ruiz, Treasurer of the
22 Papago Council are authorized to negotiate and execute any and all
23 contracts, amendments and documents necessary to secure funding for
24 the continued operation of the Head Start Program.


25 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 11th
26 day of April, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
27 1140.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and -0- absent, pursuant to the
28 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) (f) and (k) of Article
29 V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
30 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the
31 Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act
32 of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by

1 the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment
2 by the Papago Council.
