

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL  
(Support of Early Childhood Standards)

RES. NO. 27-85

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has over the past five years expressed its support  
2 for the development of Early Childhood programs requesting the Bureau  
3 of Indian Affairs to develop certain standards to qualify Pre-  
4 Kindergarten programs for formula funding;

5 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has directed and authorized tribal officials to take  
6 whatever steps as necessary to secure the funding of its Early Childhood  
7 program from the Bureau of Indian Affairs; and

8 WHEREAS, The Congress of the United States has told the Bureau of Indian Affairs  
9 it will not fund Pre-Kindergarten programs without the standards thereby  
10 cutting off all funds for Early Childhood programs;

11 WHEREAS, The Papago Early Childhood program will be affected seriously by a  
12 lack of funding and may mean the closure of the schools;


13 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it hereby directs and  
14 urges the Bureau of Indian Affairs to finalize the draft standards to  
15 include Pre-Kindergarten programs in the Indian School Equalization  
16 Formula for funding.

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the tribal officials are  
18 hereby authorized to take whatever steps may be necessary to intervene  
19 if the Bureau fails to revise/finalize the standards;

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it respectfully urges Congress  
21 to continue the status quo regarding funding keeping the Early Childhood  
22 program in operation until the standards are developed/finalized.

23 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 06th  
24 day of February, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote  
25 of 1,440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 03 absent, pursuant to the  
26 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a), (d), (h) and (k) of  
27 Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as  
28 amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the  
29 Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act  
30 of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by  
31 the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment  
32 by the Papago Council.
