

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Funds Available to Tribes for Behavioral Health Services)

RES. NO. 28-85

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Community Health Board which is appointed by the Papago
2 Tribal Council is responsible for the overall health care issues of the
3 Papago people;

4 WHEREAS, The Papago Community Health Board has reviewed correspondence from the
5 Arizona Department of Health Services in regard to Tribal governments'
6 range of choices in contracting with Arizona for behavioral health
7 services;


8 WHEREAS, Those choices for the Papago Tribe consist of subcontracting with an
9 intertribal or county/regional entity, or directly with the State of
10 Arizona Department of Health Services;

11 WHEREAS, Requests for proposals for utilization of Arizona's behavioral health
12 funds are expected to be announced in February, 1985.


13 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that it intends to
14 receive and review behavioral health proposal material in a direct,
15 governmental capacity with the State of Arizona.

16 The Foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 06th
17 day of February, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
18 of 1,440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and -0- absent, pursuant to
19 the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a), (h) of Article V
20 of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
21 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary
22 of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June
23 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the
24 Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by
25 the Papago Council.
