

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL  
(Application for Preliminary Loan for Low-Income  
Public Housing AZ 26-27)

RES. NO. 353-85

1 WHEREAS, It is the policy of this locality to eliminate substandard and other  
2 inadequate housing, to prevent the spread of slums and blight, and to  
3 realize as soon as feasible the goal of a decent home in a suitable  
4 living environment for all of its citizens; and

5  
6 WHEREAS, Under the provisions of the United States Housing Act of 1937, as  
7 amended, the United States of America, acting through the Secretary of  
8 Housing and Urban Development (herein called the "Government"), is  
9 authorized to provide financial assistance to local public housing  
10 agencies for undertaking and carrying out preliminary planning of low-  
11 income housing projects that will assist in meeting this goal; and

12 WHEREAS, The act provides that there shall be local determination of need for  
13 low-income housing to meet needs not being adequately met by private  
14 enterprise and that the Government shall not make any contract with  
15 a public housing agency for preliminary loans for surveys and planning  
16 in respect to any low-income housing projects unless the governing  
17 body of the locality involved has by resolution approved the appli-  
18 cation of the public housing agency for such preliminary loan; and

19  
20 WHEREAS, Section 213 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974  
21 provides that the local unit of government be given the opportunity  
22 to comment on and/or object to the approval of an application on  
23 grounds of inconsistency with local housing assistance planning; and

24  
25 WHEREAS, The Papago Indian Housing Authority (herein called "Local Authority")  
26 is a public housing agency and is applying to the Government for a  
27 preliminary loan to cover the costs of surveys and planning in con-  
28 nection with the development of low-income housing;

29 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Council of Papago Tribe as  
30 follows:

- 31  
32 1. That there exists within the jurisdiction of this Governing  
Council a need for such low-income housing which is not being

- 1 met by private enterprise.
- 2 2. That the application of the Local Authority to the Government for
- 3 a preliminary loan in an amount not to exceed 3 percent of the
- 4 Total Development Cost which can be supported by the amount of the
- 5 ACC for surveys and planning in connection with low-income housing
- 6 projects of not to exceed approximately 10 dwelling units is
- 7 hereby approved.
- 8 3. That there is no objection to the Local Authority's application to
- 9 HUD for additional housing, (a) due to any inconsistency with a
- 10 HUD-approved Housing Assistance Plan for the locality or localities
- 11 under consideration; or (b) since a definite need for the housing
- 12 exists even though a Housing Assistance Plan may not be in effect;
- 13 and (c) since public facilities and services are or will be a-
- 14 vailable and adequate to serve the proposed housing in the areas
- 15 mentioned.
- 16 4. The Indian Housing Authority will proceed with the project as
- 17 acquisition of existing housing or rehabilitation as required by
- 18 S 6 (h) of the Act, if the Field Office determines as a result of
- 19 HUD review of the submitted cost comparison (or insufficient ex-
- 20 isting housing) documentation that rehabilitation or acquisition
- 21 of existing housing would cost less than new construction (or that
- 22 sufficient existing housing is available).

23 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 13th day

24 of May, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,440.0

25 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 01 absent, pursuant to the authority

26 vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a), (d), (f) and (h) of Article V of

27 the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified

28 by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the


29 Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934

30 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of


31 the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago
