

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(Amendment to Tribal Resolution No. 359-85 BIA/Tribal Budget Priorities)


1 WHEREAS, The Papago Council did identify certain roads within the Papago
2 Reservation requiring maintenance and renovation; and
3
4 WHEREAS, This listing is being considered as priority for funding purposes and
5 is recorded by the Bureau of Indian Affairs as such; and
6
7 WHEREAS, Annually, the Bureau of Indian Affairs seeks appropriations to carry
8 out road construction projects in accordance with this priority system;
9
10 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has, periodically, amended this list, including
11 roads not previously identified and directed their inclusion on the
12 priority list;

14 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has identified roads which require hard surfacing
15 and is desirous of including them on the priority listing urging the
16 Bureau of Indian Affairs to add them as priorities;

18 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby add to
19 the priority listing of roads requiring hard surfacing the following
20 roads:

- 21 a. Health Complex, parking lot
- 22 b. Education Building, parking lot
- 23 c. East Chui Chu
- 24 d. Papago Farms
- 25 e. Christian Academy School road
- 26 f. Hickiwan Road
- 27 g. Little Tucson
- 28 h. Big Fields
- 29 i. San Simon School Route
- 30 j. Pisinemo school Route
- 31 k. Gu Vo School Route
- 32 l. Palo Verde Stand
- 33 m. Ak Chin School Route

26 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 5th
27 day of June, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
28 1440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and -0- absent, pursuant to the
29 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a), (d) and (f) of Article
30 V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
31 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary
32 of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June
18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the
Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by
the Papago Council.
