RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(Sells Liquor Referendum)

RES. NO. 362-85

WHEREAS, the Sells District Council did on April 11, 1985, by Resolution No. 1685, request that the Papago Election Board put to a vote of the registered voters of the Sells District a referendum of whether the Sells District should sanction the introduction, sale, possession and consumption of spirituous liquor within the exterior boundaries of the Sells District in conformity of the Alcoholic Beverages Licensing and 7 Control Ordinance of the Papago Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Papago Election Board did submit the referendum to a vote of the registered voters of the Sells District and did issue and post its Certificate of Election Results verifying that the referendum had failed by a vote of 169 for and 175 against, all in conformity with Section 4 of the Alcoholic Beverage Licensing and Control Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the introduction, sale, possession and consumption of spirituous liquor within the exterior boundaries of the Sells District remain subject to all of the prohibitions of the federal Indian liquor laws, 18 U.S.C. §§ 1154 and 1156 and of the laws of the Papago Tribe.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 5th day of June, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1159.0 for; 352.5 against; 128.5 not voting; and -0- absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (f) and (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
