

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(JTPA InterGovernmental Agreement)

RES. NO. 370-85

1 WHEREAS, the Job Training Partnership Act was enacted into law in 1982
2 replacing the Comprehensive Employment Training Act (CETA); and
3
4 WHEREAS, funding is made available to state and tribal governments to establish
5 programs for improving the employment prospects of eligible persons
6 through the designation of service delivery areas; and
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8 WHEREAS, the State of Arizona is entitled to JTPA funds to develop a network
9 of employment training programs throughout the State; and
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11 WHEREAS, the Indian Reservations in Arizona have been designated as service
12 delivery areas and are eligible to receive State JTPA funds; and
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14 WHEREAS, the Papago JTPA office may apply for State JTPA funds pursuant to
15 InterGovernmental Agreement with the State of Arizona; and

17 WHEREAS, representatives of the Papago JTPA office and the State of Arizona,
18 Department of Economic Security are the parties responsible in
19 negotiating such agreements.


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21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it hereby authorizes
22 the Papago JTPA office to negotiate InterGovernmental Agreements with
23 the State of Arizona DES, for the delivery of JTPA services on the
24 Papago Reservation.

26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman or appropriate Tribal officials are
27 hereby authorized to sign and execute InterGovernmental Agreements and
28 any amendments or modifications thereto which have been negotiated by
29 the Papago JTPA office on behalf of the Papago Tribe.

30 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 6th
31 day of June, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
32 1640.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 02 absent, pursuant to the
authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d), (e) and (f) of Article
V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary
of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June
18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the
Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by
the Papago Council.
