

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(Administration, Children, Youth and Families)

RES. NO. 387-85

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe has operated successfully a Headstart, Early  
2 Childhood and Day Care program for its young members; and

3 WHEREAS, Funding for the operation of these programs has depended in large on  
4 meritorious proposals by the Papago Tribe to various funding agencies  
5 designed to fund programs oriented toward children; and

7 WHEREAS, The Department of Economic Security through the Administration for  
8 Children, Youth and Families provides funds for certain eligible  
9 services; and

10 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe is desirous of seeking supplemental funds from the  
11 Department of Economic Security to continue operation of its day care  
12 programs;

14 WHEREAS, All of the child-oriented programs have proven beneficial and valuable  
15 to the Papago Tribe and its people, especially its young members;


16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby  
17 approve the proposal to the Department of Economic Security, Admin-  
18 istration for Children, Youth and Families for funding in the form of  
19 reimbursement for the continued operation of the day care services  
20 program;

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Josiah Moore, Chairman; Francisco Jose, Vice-  
22 Chairman or Rosita N. Ruiz, Treasurer are hereby authorized and  
23 directed to negotiate and execute any and all contracts, amendments  
24 and documents necessary to secure funding from the Administration for  
25 Children, Youth and Families.


27 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 7th  
28 day of June, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of  
29 1640.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 4 absent, pursuant to the  
30 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (h) of Article V of  
31 the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified  
32 by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the  
Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934  
(48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of  
the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago  
Council.
