

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL


(Amendment to proposed TERO Ordinance)

RES. NO. 46-85

1 WHEREAS, The Tribal Employment Rights Ordinance was enacted into law by the  
2 Papago Council in 1978; and  
3 WHEREAS, A Council Representative has requested an increase in the membership of  
4 the Commission from three members to five to be drafted into a pro-  
5 posed revised Tribal Employment Rights Ordinance;  
6 WHEREAS, The TERO Ordinance authorized the collection of a one half of one  
7 percent Employment Rights fee on certain prescribed activities;  
8 WHEREAS, The Tax collected pursuant to the TERO Ordinance has been used to  
9 support the TERO Commission and Office activities;  
10 WHEREAS, The Papago Council believes the tax should properly be deposited into  
11 the Tribe's General Fund; and  
12 WHEREAS, The TERO Office should be required to submit yearly budgets justifying  
13 the need for funds like other tribal departments;  
14 WHEREAS, Funds are scarce for all tribal departments and require that the  
15 Papago Council safeguard all revenues;  
16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby  
17 support the revision of the TERO Ordinance, in particular the increase  
18 in membership from 3 to 5 members; and  
19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the TERO Ordinance be amended so the one half of  
20 one percent Employment Rights fee collected on defined activities  
21 covered by the TERO Ordinance will be deposited in to the Papago Tribe's  
22 General Fund and that the TERO Commission will submit an annual budget  
23 with justification for consideration by the Papago Council.

24 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 08th  
25 day of February, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote  
26 of 1,440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and -0- absent, pursuant to  
27 the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (f), (h) and (m) of  
28 Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as  
29 amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the  
Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the  
Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review  
by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enact-  
ment by the Papago Council.
