

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Approving Acceptance of IMPL Distribution
Determination)

RES. NO. 533-85

1 WHEREAS, Congress did by P.L. 97-257 mandate that all unobligated fund balances
2 on deposit in BIA IMPL accounts as of the close of business on Sep-
3 tember 30, 1982, including the income resulting from the investments
4 of funds from such accounts, be impounded and held in escrow accounts,
5 and that the Secretary of the Interior must, prior to September 30,
6 1985, determine the extent to which the funds held in such escrow
7 accounts represent income from the investment of special deposits
8 relating to Indian tribes or individual Indians, and, upon such
9 determination by the Secretary and express acceptance thereof by the
10 beneficiary, the Secretary must transfer such funds to trust accounts
11 for such tribes or individual Indians; and


13 WHEREAS, The Superintendent of the Papago Indian Agency has advised the Papago
14 Council by letter dated May 29, 1985, that the Secretary has made a
15 determination that the Papago Tribe is a potential beneficiary of
16 IMPL funds and, as such, is tentatively entitled to an IMPL distri-
17 bution of \$56,415.00, plus interest from April 30, 1985, which
18 distribution represents income from the investment of special deposits
19 of the Papago Tribe between September 30, 1976 and March 31, 1981.
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21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
22 approve acceptance of the determination by the Secretary and does
23 hereby authorize the Chairman of the Papago Council to sign the
24 acceptance on behalf of the Papago Tribe.
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26 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 10th
27 day of July, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
28 1,640.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and -0- absent, pursuant to the
29 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (d) and Section
30 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of
31 Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and
approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to
Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not
subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the
date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
