

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Authorizing Operation of JTPA Programs)

RES. NO. 536-85


1 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe, as grantee, operates JTPA Programs (Successor of
2 the CETA Program) on the Papago Reservation through the Office of
3 JTPA, Programs; and

4 WHEREAS, Both the CETA and JTPA Programs have been of great value to the Papago
5 people, and it is essential to continue the JTPA Programs.

7 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
8 authorize funding, development, operation and continuance of JTPA
9 Programs on the Papago Reservation, through the Office of JTPA
10 Programs, and does hereby authorize the Office of JTPA Programs to
11 negotiate, and the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Papago Council
12 to execute, any contract, agreement or document or amendments thereto,
13 with the Federal or State governments, or any departments, agencies
14 or subdivisions thereof, including schools and school districts, and
15 with any private or public corporations or organizations, which
16 are necessary or incidental to the funding, development, operation or
17 continuance of such Programs on the Papago Reservation, hereby
18 ratifying any act or acts of the Office of JTPA Programs or of the
19 Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Papago Council in negotiating or
20 executing such contract, agreement or document, or any amendments
21 thereto, for and on behalf of the Papago Tribe.

24 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 10th
25 day of July, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
26 1,640.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 01 absent, pursuant to the
27 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) (e) and (h) of Article
28 V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
29 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secre-
30 tary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of
31 June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the
32 Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by
the Papago Council.


