

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(Demographic Data Resolution)

RES. NO. 66-85

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe of Arizona has submitted an application for a grant
2 under the Community Development Block Grant Program for Indian Tribes;
3 and

4 WHEREAS, The CDBG Regulations, 24 CFR 571.300(c), allows applicants to provide
5 demographic data that are unpublished and not generally available;


6 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe has determined that current available demographic
7 data is not accurate and incomplete and that the Papago Tribe can
8 independently verify such data on its own collecting such data in a
9 systematic manner;

10 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe elects to satisfy the demographic data requirements
11 of the CDBG Grant requirements by submitting its own data;


12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
13 certify that: The Papago Tribe does believe that generally available,
14 published data is substantially inaccurate or incomplete, and that the
15 Papago Tribe does have available demographic data that has been
16 collected in a systematic manner which can be independently verified
17 for completeness or accuracy and that this data will differentiate
18 between the reservation and BIA service area populations generally
19 published and available.

20 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 8th
21 day of March, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
22 1440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 2 absent, pursuant to
23 the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a), (f) and (h) of
24 Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as
25 amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the
Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act
of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by
the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment
by the Papago Council.
