

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(Papago Crisis Prevention Program)

RES. NO. 676-85

1 WHEREAS, Congress has enacted the Justice Assistance Act of 1984, which
2 establishes a block grant program to improve the criminal justice
3 system; and

4 WHEREAS, Governor Bruce Babbitt has named the Arizona Department of Public
5 Safety to serve as the State Office to administer the block grant in
6 Arizona; and


7 WHEREAS, there is a need to educate the Papago people and encourage community
8 participation in decreasing crime.

9 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
10 approve the Law Enforcement Department to apply for funding from the
11 Arizona Department of Public Safety for a crime prevention program.


12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Josiah Moore, Chairman, Francisco Jose, Jr., Vice
13 Chairman or Rosita Ruiz, Treasurer, of the Papago Council are hereby
14 authorized to negotiate and execute all necessary documents to secure
15 funding for a crime prevention program.

16 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 12th day
17 of September, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
18 1581.5 for; -0- against; 58.5 not voting; and 01 absent, pursuant to the
19 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a), (e) and (h) Article V
20 of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
21 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary
22 of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June
23 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the
24 Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by
25 the Papago Council.
