

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(Citizen Participation)


RES. NO. 67-85

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe has submitted an application for a grant to fund  
2 certain eligible Indian Community Development Block Grant Program  
3 activities and in connection with such application resolve and made  
4 certain assurances.

5 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that prior to the submission of its application,  
6 the governing body of the applicant has: Provided Tribal citizens,  
7 especially those living in areas where activities are proposed or  
8 ongoing, with adequate information concerning the amount of funds  
9 available for proposed community development and housing activities,  
10 the range of activities that may be assisted, and other important  
11 program requirements, and solicited their views and participation;  
12 followed traditional Tribal means of citizen involvement that included  
13 holding at least one adequately publicized meeting of the Tribal  
14 Council at a time and location convenient to Tribal citizens which  
15 provided them with adequate opportunity to articulate needs, express  
16 preferences about proposal community development and housing activities,  
17 assist in the selection of priorities and otherwise participate in the  
18 development of the application; considered any comments or views  
19 expressed by Tribal members and has modified the application accordingly;  
20 made the modified application available to Tribal members for review  
21 and comments.

22 The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 8th  
23 day of March, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of  
24 1302.0 for; 138.0 against; -0- not voting; and 2 absent, pursuant to the  
25 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (h) of Article V  
26 of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,  
27 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secre-  
28 tary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of  
29 June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 948). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the  
30 Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by  
31 the Papago Council.
