

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Campaign Ethics regarding vehicles and Tribal business hours)

RES. NO. 167-87

1 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Nation is in the process of conducting its 1987
2 General Election; and

3 WHEREAS, allegations regarding misuse of tribal vehicles during tribal business
4 hours for political activities were raised at the May 1, 1987 Council
5 meeting; and


6 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council for the record deplores such
7 activities; and

8 WHEREAS, policies regarding campaign ethics are not in place.



10 NOW ,THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council that
11 abuse of tribal vehicles and campaigning during tribal business hours
12 are prohibited for candidates seeking offices during the 1987 Tohono
13 O'Odham Nation's General Election unless such campaigning is on the
14 Candidates own time.

15 The foregoing resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 1st
16 day of May, 1987, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
17 1287.0 for; 183.5 against; 169.5 not voting; and 01 absent, pursuant to the
18 powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (g) of Article VI of the Constitu-
19 tion of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on
20 January 18, 1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary -
21 Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act
22 of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
