

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Establishing Livestock Feed Emergency Program)

RES. NO. 256-87

1 WHEREAS, this Council did, by Resolution No. 255-87, authorize and direct the
2 Chairman or other appropriate officers of the Nation, via the Superin-
3 tendent of the Sells Agency, to seek a source of emergency livestock
4 feed grain for the Tohono O'odham Nation, as a designated acute
5 distress area; and

6 WHEREAS, it will be necessary to put into place an emergency administrative
7 mechanism for the transport, processing, and distribution of the feed
8 grain when it arrives.

9 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that it does hereby designate the Agriculture
10 Extension Program, under the direction of Gene Tashquith, as the
11 Livestock Feed Emergency Program ("Program") to undertake the imple-
12 mentation of any emergency livestock feed grain program which may
13 become available to the Tohono O'odham Nation as a designated acute
14 distress area.

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Program negotiate with the Golden Eagle Milling
17 Co., or other appropriate livestock feed processor, to receive,
18 process and deliver feed grain made available through agencies of the
19 United States, in such quantities as the Program can optimally provide
20 to the owners of Indian-owned subsistence livestock.


21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Program provide the processed feed grain to
22 owners of such livestock for an administrative fee of \$2.00 per bag,
23 which shall include the cost of transportation, processing and
24 distribution thereof, including the Program's special personnel cost
25 necessary to handle the distribution.

27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Acting Treasurer attempt to work out a payment
28 plan with the feed processor to finance the costs of transporting and
29 processing the grain and feed grain overtime so that these costs can
30 be paid from the fees collected in the distribution of the feed grain,
31 or, alternatively, that these costs be paid out of unexpended FY 1987
32 revenues of the Nation.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the appropriate committees of the Council and the appropriate officers of the Nation develop a plan which will in the future address these perennial, cyclical and acute livestock feed problems before they result in severe loss of livestock and livestock resources.

The foregoing resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 17th day of July, 1987, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,640.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and -0- absent, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (b) (c) and (d) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
