## RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Priorities for Federal FY 88 Appropriations)

1	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation's Appropriations Committee was appointed by
2		Resolution Number 12-87 consisting of Angelo Joaquin Sr., Chairman
3		Rosemary Lopez, Vice Chairman, Julia Carrillo and Edward Kisto; and
4	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council has been advised that the
5		sequestrations mandated by Gramm-Rudman (the Balanced Budget and
6		Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, P.L. 99-177) will have a very
7		serious impact on FY 87 funded Indian programs, and that they may
8 9		have a devastating impact on future programs unless Congress substan-
9 10		tially increases FY 88 funding levels therefor; and
11	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council has appointed a special
12		delegation of its members to travel to Washington, D.C. and testify
13		before the Appropriate Committees of Congress concerning Federal
14		FY 88 Appropriations for Indian programs; and
15	WHEREAS .	in an attempt to inform Congress, the Tohono O'odham Legislative
16	whence is a	Council has attempted to prioritize and list those tribal programs

18		which, if the funding levels therefor are reduced below present
19		appropriations, would be most seriously affected and thus critically
20		impact the education, health and welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation
21		and its members.
22	NOW, THE	REFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that
23 24		it respectfully urges Congress to assure that FY 88 appropriations to
24 25		cover the following programs administered under the provisions of
26		the Snyder Act, 25 U.S.C. 13, be set at such levels that they
27	1922	will not be affected either by sequestrations or executive
28		rescissions, namely:
