

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL  
(BIA Education Delivery Initiatives)

RES. NO. 70-87

1 WHEREAS, Interior Assistant Secretary, Ross Swimmer, has made public his  
2 education delivery initiatives which would go into affect during  
3 FY'88; and

4 WHEREAS, his proposal to transfer BIA Education, via contracts, to tribal  
5 and/or state education systems is totally unacceptable at this time;  
6 and


7 WHEREAS, forced contracting would result in unsatisfactory delivery of educat-  
8 ion services to Tohono O'odham students; and

9 WHEREAS, the Comprehensive Education Plan of the Tohono O'odham Nation ident-  
10 ifies as one of its goals the contracting all BIA schools on the  
11 Tohono O'odham Nation.


13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation is in full  
14 opposition to Assistant Secretary Ross Swimmer's proposed education  
15 delivery initiative to transfer Education Services through forced  
16 contracting with tribes and/or state education systems.

18 The foregoing resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 2nd  
19 day of March, 1987, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of  
20 1523.0 for; -0- against; 117.0 not voting; and 05 absent, pursuant to the  
21 powers vested in the Council by Section 1 c 2 & f of Article VI of the  
22 Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation  
on January 18, 1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary -  
Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act  
of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).


1 Said Resolution was submitted for approval to the office of the Chairman of the
