

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Vocational Education)

RES. NO. 71-87

1 WHEREAS, the President's FY 88 Budget recommends the elimination of Vocational
2 Education dollars; and

3 WHEREAS, Vocational Education is an important component of the overall education
4 activities of the Nation; and

5 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Skill Center is currently funded by Federal dollars
6 through the Department of Education, Washington, D.C.; and

7 WHEREAS, although this is the final year of funding by the Department of
8 Education, the Tohono O'odham Nation would still be eligible to apply
9 through the state; and

11 WHEREAS, if vocational education programs are not budgeted, there will be a
12 definite negative impact on the Tohono O'odham Nation through the loss
13 of vocational education opportunities.

14 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham opposes elimination of
15 Vocational Education dollars as indicated in the President's FY 88
16 Budget.

18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation recommends that Federal
19 Vocational Education programs be budgeted to meet the needs of Native
20 Americans throughout the country.

21 The foregoing resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 2nd
22 day of March, 1987, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
23 1094.5 for; 349.5 against; 196.5 not voting; and 05 absent, pursuant to the
24 powers vested in the Council by Section 1 f of Article VI of the Constitution
25 of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January
18, 1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary Indian Affairs
(Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18,
1934 (48 Stat. 984).
