2 WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 02-89, "Defining the Powers, Duties, and
3 Authority of the Office of Independent Counsel" was
4 vetoed by the Chairman of the Nation and failed an
5 override attempt by the Legislature; and

6 WHEREAS, an amended ordinance titled, "Defining the Powers,
7 Duties, and Authority of the Office of Independent
8 Counsel," which addressed the veto concerns of the
9 Chairman of the Nation, was proposed for Council
10 reconsideration; and


11 WHEREAS, before action on this ordinance is taken, the Membership
12 of the Tohono O'odham Nation should be given an oppor-
13 tunity to review and comment on said proposed ordinance.

14 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative
15 Council that the amended proposed ordinance titled,
16 "Defining the Powers, Duties, and Authority of the
17 Office of Independent Counsel" is hereby tabled and
18 referred to the respective Districts of the Tohono
19 O'odham Nation for review and recommendation.

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the recommendations of the Nation's
21 Districts concerning the proposed ordinance titled,
22 "Defining the Powers, Duties, and Authority of the
23 Office of Independent Counsel" be return to the next
24 session of the Legislative Council.


25 The foregoing Legislative Order was passed by the Tohono O'odham
26 Council on the 9th. day of June, 1989 at a meeting at which a
27 quorum was present with a vote of 447.5 for; 1,157.0 against;
28 119.5 not voting; and 01 absent, pursuant to the powers vested
29 in the Council by Section 1 (a) of Article VI of the Constitu-
30 tion of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham
Nation on January 18, 1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy
Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6,
1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48
Stat. 984).
