## RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Right-of-Way for C.A.P. Water Pipeline)

	WHEREAS,	the Bureau of Reclamation has need for a right-of-way
1		across two (2) miles of Tribal land in the San Xavier
2		District for the purpose of installing a 78" underground
3		pipeline, as part of the main C.A.P. water delivery
4		system, for the delivery of C.A.P. water to the Nation's
5		new farm area, the San Xavier Co-operative Association
6		farms and to the Southern Boundary of the San Xavier
7		Reservation ending at Pima Mines Roads, a copy of the
8		route map is attached hereto and made a part hereof; and
9	WHEREAS,	allotees' lands, located on the San Xavier Reservation,
10		are also subject to the Bureau of Reclamation requests
11		for right-of-ways for the purpose of the installation of
12		this underground pipeline and above-ground appurtenances
13		utilized for the delivery of C.A.P. water to the San
14		Xavier Co-operative Association farms and to the
15		Southern Boundary of the San Xavier Reservation ending
16		at Pima Mines Road; and
17	WHEREAS,	an appraisal of the value of the tribal and allotees'
18		land to be utilized for this right-of-way has been done
19		and the conclusion of the appraiser was that the two (2)
20		mile right-of-way across tribal land, with and 80%
21		taking, would have a value of \$75,000.00 based on the
22		value of the total land utilized for the right-of-way of
23		\$93,000.00; and
24	WHEREAS,	the Nation's Legislative Natural Resource Committee has
25		reviewed the appraisal and the purpose and basis for
26		determining the value of the land to be utilized for the
27		requested right-of-way and after several meetings with
28		parties involved, has decided that the purposes for the
29		right-of-way will require a 100% taking of the land
30		involved and that the Bureau of Reclamation should pay
31		the Nation 100% of the appraised value thereof; and

WHEREAS, it would be in the best interest of the Nation if the Nation made a demand for payment of 100% of the appraised value (\$93,000.00) for the land to be utilized for this right-of-way.

the Tohono O'odham THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that NOW, 5 Legislative Council does hereby demand that the Bureau 6 of Reclamation pay to the Nation 100% of the appraisal 7 value (\$93,000.00) for the right-of-way across the two 8 miles of Tribal lands within the San Xavier Reservation, 9 to be utilized for the purpose of the installation of a 10 78" pipeline for the delivery of C.A.P. water to the 11 Nation's new farm area, the San Xavier Co-operative 12 Association farms and to the Southern Boundary of the 13 San Xavier Reservation. 14

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Nation forward this demand to the Bureau of Reclamation and if accepted, the Chairman of the Nation is authorized to execute all necessary agreements or other documents to effectuate this two (2) mile right-of-way.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the <u>26th.</u> day of <u>Janaury</u>, <u>1989</u> at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>962.5</u> for; <u>566.5</u> against; <u>111.0</u> not voting; and <u>01</u> absent, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by <u>Section 1 (f) & 2 (d)</u> of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
