

LEGISLATIVE ORDER OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM COUNCIL
(Referral of Equal Access to Justice Act regarding the T.O.P.S.
Recision to the Budget & Finance Committee)

LEGISLATIVE ORDER NO. 280-89

1 WHEREAS, on August 16, 1989 the Tohono O'odham Legislative
2 Council discussed the T.O.P.S. recision decision and the
3 possibility of recouping legal fees through the Equal
4 Access to Justice Act; and

5 WHEREAS, the Nation needs to met certain eligibility criteria
6 under the Equal Access to Justice Act in order to be
7 reimbursed for legal costs acquired in the suit
8 involving the recision of the T.O.P.S. Program by Indian
9 Health Services; and

10 WHEREAS, in order to determine reimbursement eligibility of legal
11 costs under the Act, the Nation is required to provide
12 financial disclosure of its assets and other pertinent
13 financial information; and

14 WHEREAS, a recommendation was made to refer this matter to the
15 Legislative Budget and Finance Committee for further
16 investigation.


17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative
18 Council hereby refers the application for reimbursement
19 of legal expenses under the Equal Access to Justice Act
20 to the Budget and Finance Committee for further
21 investigation.

22 The foregoing Order was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on
23 the 16th day of August, 1989 at a meeting at which a quorum was
24 present with a vote of 790.0 for; 302.0 against; 632.0 not
25 voting; 02 absent, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council
26 by Section 1(a) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono
O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January
18, 1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary-
Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to
Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
