

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Requesting NCAI Support for Health Care At San Xavier)

RES. NO. 349-89

1 WHEREAS, the San Xavier District of the Tohono O'Odham Nation
2 views the health and well being of its community members
3 as one of the primary areas of concern; and

4 WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service is currently the primary
5 provider of health care services at San Xavier
6 Reservation and that these services by the United States
7 Government is a trust responsibility; and

8 WHEREAS, the San Xavier District has been informed that the
9 Office of Health Programs Research & Development of the
10 Indian Health Service Tucson Area are in the process of
11 relocating the research and development and technical
12 support functions to Albuquerque, New Mexico within the
13 next two years; and

14 WHEREAS, the present San Xavier Health Clinic Building has been
15 deemed, by the Indian Health Services, to be in an
16 unsound and unsafe condition; and

17 WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service plans to phase out health care
18 services at the San Xavier Health Clinic, due to the
19 move to Albuquerque and the unsoundness of the current
20 structure; and

21 WHEREAS, the San Xavier Health Clinic provides health care
22 services to the urban Indian population of the Tucson
23 Area, which has increased significantly.

24 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'Odham
25 Legislative Council hereby requests that the Indian
26 Health Service continue providing optimum health care
27 services to members of the Tohono O'Odham Nation at San
28 Xavier (Wa:k O'Odham) regardless whether or not the
29 research and development functions move to Albuquerque.

30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council
31 that Indian Health Service seek and obtain funding to

1 construct a new health care facility for the Wa:k
2 O'Odham at San Xavier to replace the present health
3 clinic.


4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council
5 that it fully supports San Xavier District's request of
6 the clinic to be located in the same area as the current
7 clinic.

8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council
9 that Indian Health Service seek and obtain additional
10 funding to accommodate the increased usage of the San
11 Xavier Health Clinic by the urban Indian population in
12 the Tucson Area.


13 BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council
14 that it hereby reinforces and supports this resolution
15 and presents it on behalf of the Wa:k O'Odham to the
16 46th Annual National Congress of American Indians
17 Conference in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, in October 1989.

18 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council
19 on the 28th. day of September, 1989 at a meeting at which a
20 quorum was present with a vote of 1,531.0 for; 57.0 against;
21 136.0 not voting; and -0- absent, pursuant to the powers
22 vested in the Council by Section 1 (j) of Article VI of the
23 Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono
24 O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986, and approved by the Acting
25 Deputy Assistant Secretary -Indian Affairs (Operations) on March
26 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48
27 Stat. 984).


