

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL  
(Approving Juvenile Justice and Delinquency  
Prevention Subgrant 1989)

RES. NO. 357-89

1 WHEREAS, the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act of  
2 1974, as amended by the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency  
3 Prevention Amendment of 1988 (subtitle F of title VII of  
4 the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988, P.L. 100-690) has been  
5 reauthorized and modified to include a funding pass-  
6 through requirement for Indian tribes; and

7 WHEREAS, the Indian pass-through funds are determined by the  
8 proportion of reservation youth to total Arizona youth  
9 and for 1989 the State of Arizona estimated this  
10 allocation at \$50,531.00; and

11 WHEREAS, the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act was  
12 enacted to authorize funding to states which targeted  
13 juvenile delinquency activities toward jail and lockup  
14 removal; and

15 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Judiciary has been actively diverting  
16 O'Odham youth from lockup by carrying out a Diversion  
17 Program for eligible youth; and

18 WHEREAS, the availability of Juvenile Justice funds provided an  
19 opportunity for the Tohono O'Odham Judiciary to expend  
20 the Diversion Program with more alternative activities;  
21 and

22 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Judiciary did submit an application  
23 for a grant under the Indian pass-through allocation and  
24 was successful resulting in a subgrant award of  
25 \$8,097.00 for 1989-90; and

26 WHEREAS, the subgrant award will supplement Diversion activities  
27 and establish a law related education program for first  
28 offenders as an alternative to formal prosecution and  
29 disposition; and


30 WHEREAS, a resolution approving the initial application and  
31 accepting the award are requirements before the subgrant  
32 award becomes official.


1 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative  
2 Council that it does hereby approve the application  
3 submitted by the Tohono O'odham Nation to receive  
4 Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention funds for  
5 the purpose of expanding existing diversions activities.

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman, Vice Chairman, or other  
7 legally designated official are hereby authorized and  
8 directed to negotiate and execute the subgrant documents  
9 and any amendments thereto for the duration of the  
10 subgrant, provided however, that any amendments  
11 affecting the funding or funding levels of the subgrant  
12 shall be submitted for further prior approval by the  
13 Council.

15 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council  
16 on the 24th. day of October, 1989 at a meeting at which a  
17 quorum was present with a vote of 1,558.0 for; -0- against;  
18 -0- not voting; and 166.0 absent, pursuant to the powers vested  
19 in the Council by Section 1 (f) of Article VI of the  
20 Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono  
21 O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986, and approved by the Acting  
22 Deputy Assistant Secretary -Indian Affairs (Operations) on March  
23 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48  
24 Stat. 984).






