## RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Agency Superintendent for Education, Report and Recommendations on BIA School System)

RES. NO. 359-89

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1	WHEREAS,	the Legislative Council's Human Resources Development
2		Committee and the Executive Branch have investigated the
3		John Boone child sex abuse case. The investigation shows
4		the Agency Superintendent for Education deceived the
5		Tohono O'odham by not declaring the facts of the matter.
6	WHEREAS,	the Human Resources/Executive Branch investigation of the
7		Boone case further shows that prior to the summer of 1985
8		the Agency Superintendent for Education knew there was a
9		possibility Boone would eventually be charged with child
10		sex abuse. There is the appearance that the Agency
11		Superintendent for Education secured the principal's
12		employment at the Santa Rosa Boarding School in the summer
13		of 1985 in order to insulate him from the charges of
14		administrative negligence that would follow Boone's
15		arrest.
16		FAILURE TO CONSULT
17	WHEREAS,	on or about March 22, 1989, the Agency Superintendent for
18		Education was advised, in a writing from the Chairman of
19		the Tohono O'odham Nation, that he had an incurable
20		conflict of interest and therefore could not advise the
21		Santa Rosa Boarding School Board with respect to renewing
22		the employment contract of the school's principal.
23	WHEREAS,	following receipt by the Agency Superintendent for
24		Education of the Chairman's March 22, 1989 letter, a
25		meeting of the Santa Rosa Boarding School Board was held
26		in Casa Grande on or about April 4, 1989. Without giving
27		notice of any kind to the Chairman or any other tribal
28		government official, the Agency Superintendent for
29		Education appeared at the Casa Grande meeting and advised
30		the Board to approve a new contract with the principal.
31		A new contract was approved during the Casa Grande
32		meeting.

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1	WHEREAS,	by advising the Santa Rosa Boarding School Board to
2		recontract with the principal without first consulting
3		with the Chairman or any other tribal government official,
4		the Agency Superintendent for Education violated the
5		federal laws mandating tribal consultation (20 U.S.C. Sec.
6		2010.b and related regulations).
7	2	PERFORMANCE
8	WHEREAS,	a four year assessment by the Executive and the Human
9		Resources Development Committee of the performance of the
10		Agency Superintendent for Education shows severe and
11		continuing weaknesses, including lack of ability, neglect
12		of duty, and poor attitude.
13		FRAUD IN REPORTING
14	WHEREAS,	the Agency Superintendent for Education defrauded the
15		Tohono O'odham by not properly completing required reports
16		to the federal government, school boards, and parents and
17		guardians regarding the condition of the schools.
18	VIOLA	TION OF FEDERAL AND TRIBAL INFORMATION DISCLOSURE LAWS
19	WHEREAS,	since March 1, 1989, the Agency Superintendent for
20		Education has failed to provide information lawfully
21		requested by the Chairman of the Tohono O'odham Nation
22		pursuant to 25 CFR Parts 271.16 (Access to Bureau Records)
23		and Tohono O'odham Nation Resolution No. 21-88 (Access to
24		Bureau of Indian Affairs Information and Pre-application
25		Technical Assistance).
26	2	SCHOOL BOARD AND DISTRICT ACTIONS
27	WHEREAS,	on March 28, 1989 the Tohono O'odham High School Board
28		passed a resolution demanding the removal of the Agency
29		Superintendent for Education because of lack of
30		leadership, failure to communicate, excessive absenteeism,
31		improper administration of the off-reservation school
32		attendance policy ("waivers"), poor attitude, and
		mishandling of an incident involving sexual abuse by a

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teacher at the high school. On May 1, 1989, the high 1 school board affirmed this resolution and requested 2 assistance in dealing with the issue. 3 WHEREAS, the Districts of Hickiwan and Ge Vo'o have passed 4 resolutions supporting the high school board's demand for 5 removal of the Agency Superintendent for Education. 6 ACTIONS OF THE NATION'S OFFICERS AND EDUCATION COMMITTEE 7 WHEREAS, on October 19, 1989 the Chairman, through his 8 representative, and the Legislative Council Chairman 9 jointly called for the immediate reassignment and eventual 10 termination from the federal service of the Agency 11 Superintendent for Education. 12 WHEREAS, on October 19, 1989, the Education Committee resolved 13 formally to support the call of the Chairman and the 14 Legislative Council Chairman for immediate reassignment 15 and eventual termination from the federal service of the 16 Agency Superintendent for Education. 17 WHEREAS, termination of the Agency Superintendent for Education 18 from the federal service is fully justified in the 19 circumstances and must occur in order to prevent 20 transmitting the problem to other Indian Nations. 21 UNDERLYING CAUSES 22 WHEREAS, the matters addressed in this resolution indicate that key 23 components of the BIA school system and the Tohono O'odham 24 Nation's oversight structure are not functioning properly. 25 Accordingly, the Legislative Council and the Chairman of 26 the Nation, in consultation with the affected groups and 27 individuals, are required immediately to analyze the 28 underlying causes of the problems and to take corrective 29 action. 30 31

NO. 359-89 (Agency Superintendent for Education, Report and Recommendations on BIA School System) Page Four (4) FUNDING 1 WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the United States government 2 to provide funding to assist the Tohono O'odham Nation in 3 accomplishing the purposes of this resolution. 4 CONSTITUTIONAL AUTHORITY 5 WHEREAS, the following provisions of the Tohono O'odham 6 Constitution authorize the Nation to act: Article VI, 7 Section 1(c)(2), Article VI, Section 1(c)(7), and Article 8 VI, Section 1(k). 9 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative 10 Council that: 11 IMMEDIATE TRANSFER OF AGENCY SUPERINTENDENT FOR EDUCATION 12 The Tohono O'odham Nation demands that the Secretary of 13 the Interior, the Assistant Secretary for Indian Affairs, 14 and the Director of the Office of Indian Education 15 Programs immediately transfer the Agency Superintendent 16 for Education from his present position to a position 17 which does not directly or indirectly have anything to do 18 with the Tohono O'odham BIA schools. 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the Chairman of the Tohono O'odham 20 Nation determines that transfer of the Agency 21 Superintendent for Education will not occur within a 22 reasonable period of time, he shall use all available 23 means to obtain a tribal court order removing and 24 excluding the Agency Superintendent for Education from the 25lands of the Tohono O'odham Nation pursuant to Ordinance 26 No. 02-82 (Removal and Exclusion of Non-Members). 27 TERMINATION OF AGENCY SUPERINTENDENT FOR EDUCATION 28 FROM THE FEDERAL SERVICE 29BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation finds in the 30 circumstances cause for permanent removal of the Agency 31 Superintendent for Education from the federal service. 32

NO. 359-89 (Agency Superintendent for Education, Report and Recommendations on BIA School System) Page Five (5) BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation requests the 1 United States Senate Select Committee On Indian Affairs 2 to provide for an independent investigation (with the 3 subpoena power) of all matters relating to this 4 resolution. 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation requests the 6 United States Senate Select Committee On Indian Affairs 7 to insure that the severest possible personnel action is 8 taken against the Agency Superintendent for Education. 9 APPOINTMENT OF ACTING AGENCY SUPERINTENDENT FOR EDUCATION 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Tohono O'odham 11 Nation is authorized, in consultation with the Human 12 Resources Development Committee and in his discretion 13 other groups or individuals, to make such arrangements as 14 may be necessary with the Director of the Office of Indian 15 Education Programs to provide for the appointment of a 16 person or persons to serve as the Agency Superintendent 17 for Education on an acting basis. 18 PROCEDURES FOR PERMANENT APPOINTMENT OF AGENCY 19 SUPERINTENDENT FOR EDUCATION 20BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Tohono O'odham 21 Nation shall, in consultation with the Human Resources 22 Development Committee and in his discretion other groups 23or individuals, prepare in draft -24 a) tribal legislation specifying the procedures to be followed by the Nation with respect to the appointment 25of a permanent Agency Superintendent for Education, and 26b) such special federal legislative proposals as may be 27 necessary to address the matters in issue. 28 The draft tribal legislation and federal legislative 29 proposals shall be presented for consideration at the 30 regular session of the Legislative Council to be held 31 during the month of January 1990. 32

NO. 359-89 (Agency Superintendent for Education, Report and Recommendations on BIA School System) Page Six (6) BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation requests the 1 Secretary of the Interior, the Assistant Secretary for 2 Indian Affairs, and the Director of the Office of Indian 3 Education Programs to apply with the greatest possible 4 flexibility the existing laws and regulations governing the 5 appointment of a permanent Agency Superintendent for 6 Education. 7 REPORT ON THE CONDITION OF THE BIA SCHOOL SYSTEM 8 AND RECOMMENDATIONS FOR ACTION 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Tohono O'odham 10 Nation and the Human Resources Development Committee, in 11 consultation with other groups and individuals, are 12 authorized to carry out such activities as may be necessary 13 to assess generally the BIA school system and tribal 14 a) government's relation to it, and 15 to make such recommendations for legislative or other b) 16 action as may be appropriate. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Tohono O'odham 17 18 Nation, through the Office Of the Prosecutor, is authorized 19 to file suit in the tribal courts on behalf of the Tohono O'odham Nation in order to compel release of information 20 withheld in violation of the provisions of this resolution. 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that following completion of the assessments 22 authorized here, the Chairman of the Tohono O'odham Nation 23and the Human Resources Development Committee shall, in 24 25

consultation with other groups or individuals, prepare reports with recommendations for action. Such reports and recommendations shall be presented for consideration by the Legislative Council no later than March 1990.

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FUNDING AND CONGRESSIONAL SUPPORT
 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Tohono O'odham
 Nation, in consultation with the Human Resources

NO. 359-89 (Agency Superintendent for Education, Report and Recommendations on BIA School System) Page Seven (7) Development Committee and in his discretion other groups or 1 individuals, is authorized to prepare for consideration 2 within the tribal legislative process such federal and 3 private funding proposals and applications as may be 4 necessary to accomplish the purposes of this resolution. 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation requests the 6 Arizona congressional delegation to assist in accomplishing 7 the purposes of this resolution. 8 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council 9 on the <u>24th</u> day of <u>October, 1989</u> at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>1,558.0</u> for; <u>-0-</u> against; <u>-0-</u> not voting; <u>166.0 [10]</u> absent, pursuant to the powers vested in the 10 Council by Section 1(c)(2) & (7) and (k) of Article VI of the 11 Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986, and approved by the Acting 12 Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 13 Stat. 984). 14 TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL 15 16 Edward D./Manuel, Legislative Chairman 17 , 19 89 76th day of ( )chose 18 ATTEST: 19 hours Inla 20 Legislative Secretary Teresa M.
