

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Approving the Application of the Tohono O'odham Judiciary
to Receive Juvenile Crime Reduction Funds)**

RES. NO. 376-89

1 **WHEREAS, the State of Arizona Established a Criminal Justice**
2 **Enhancement Fund consisting of funds collected as**
3 **penalty assessments on every fine, penalty and for-**
4 **feiture paid to the Courts; and**

5 **WHEREAS, twelve percent of the funds are appropriated to the**
6 **Supreme Court of Arizona for the purpose of reducing**
7 **juvenile crime; and**

8 **WHEREAS, these juvenile crime reduction funds have not been**
9 **available to Tribal Courts providing services to**
10 **juveniles until 1989 when the Chief Justice of the**
11 **Supreme Court amended the requirements making Tribal**
12 **Courts eligible for the funds; and**

13 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Judiciary did submit an application**
14 **for Juvenile Crime Reduction Funds and was notified that**
15 **such funds were awarded; and**

16 **WHEREAS, the project proposed by the Tohono O'odham Judiciary**
17 **will seek to establish an Intervention/Prevention**
18 **Program within designated schools and provide referral**
19 **and intake services for referred youth; and**

20 **WHEREAS, the objectives of the Project will be carried out by the**
21 **Intervention Resource Officers assigned to work with**
22 **designated schools; and**

23 **WHEREAS, the funds awarded by the Supreme Court will enable the**
24 **hiring of the Intervention Resource Officers assigned to**
25 **work with designated schools; and**


26 **WHEREAS, the funds awarded by the Supreme Court will enable the**
27 **hiring of the Intervention Resource Officers.**

28 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Council**
29 **that it does hereby approve the application submitted**
30 **by the Tohono O'odham Judiciary to receive Juvenile**
31 **Crime Reduction Funds for the Intervention/Prevention**
32 **Project and authorizes the receipt of such funds.**


1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council
 2 that the Tohono O'odham Nation's Officials, to wit: The
 3 Chairman, Vice Chairman and any designated official are
 4 hereby authorized to negotiate and execute the grant,
 5 provided, however, that any amendments affecting the
 6 funding or funding levels of this grant shall be
 7 submitted for further prior approval by this Council.

8 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council
 9 on the 20th day of November, 1989 at a meeting at which a quorum
 10 was present with a vote of 1,556.5 for; -0- against; 167.5 not
 11 voting; 06 absent, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council
 12 by Section 1(f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono
 13 O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January
 14 18, 1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary-
 15 Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to
 16 Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).


