

LEGISLATIVE ORDER OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM COUNCIL
(Set Aside December 5, 1989 to Discuss O'odham In Mexico Items)

LEGISLATIVE ORDER NO. 385-89

1 WHEREAS, pursuant to Legislative Order No. 381-89, "Amending
2 Council's Running Agenda - December 1989 General
3 Session" three O'odham in Mexico items were included,
4 specifically: 1) O'odham in Mexico Contract with George
5 Barnett; 2) O'odham in Mexico FY '90 Budget Modifica-
6 tion; 3) Financial Report regarding the Border Tribes
7 Summit; and

8 WHEREAS, concerns were expressed that the proposed contract and
9 the Budget Modification had not received appropriate
10 Committee reviews; and

11 WHEREAS, major funding appropriations were requested for the
12 attorney contract and budget for the O'odham in Mexico
13 Program; and

14 WHEREAS, the agenda for the morning of December 5, 1989 was set
15 aside for a discussion with Mr. Walt Mills regarding the
16 MERT Operation on the Nation; and

17 WHEREAS, the Domestic Affairs Committee contended that the
18 contract and budget were to be considered critical in
19 nature and required timely Council consideration.


20 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED by the Tohono O'odham Nation that
21 it hereby establishes December 5, 1989 of the December
22 General Session to address the O'odham in Mexico
23 attorney Contract and the O'odham in Mexico Budget.

24 BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council
25 will proceed with the O'odham in Mexico items following
26 the presentation by Mr. Walt Mills.


27 The foregoing Order was DEFEATED by the Tohono O'odham Council on
28 the 4th day of December, 1989 at a meeting at which a quorum was
29 present with a vote of 608.5 for; 735.5 against; 380.0 not
30 voting; 03 absent, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council
31 by Section 1(a) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono
32 O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January
18, 1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary-
Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to
Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
