

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL  
(Law Enforcement Services)

RES. NO. 56-89

1 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council recognizes that  
2 alcohol and drug abuse is a severe health and social  
3 problem facing the Tohono O'Odham; and

4 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council further  
5 recognizes that the importation of illegal narcotics  
6 from Mexico is a major contributory factor in our  
7 overall narcotics problem; and

8 WHEREAS, the "Anti Drug Abuse Act of 1986," provided for a  
9 \$500,000.00 allocation to the Tohono O'Odham Law  
10 Enforcement for fiscal years 1987, 1988 and 1989 for the  
11 enforcement, investigation, interdiction and eradication  
12 of narcotics on the Reservation; and

13 WHEREAS, funding for FY '89 has been halved by Congress; and

14 WHEREAS, this reduction in funding will not provide sufficient  
15 funds for the staff and material to initiate and  
16 continue the Tohono O'Odham Police Department's drug  
17 enforcement program at the level necessary; and

18 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Nation and Tohono O'Odham Police  
19 Department recognize that the drug problem will continue  
20 far beyond the three year period of funding intended  
21 under Public Law 99-570; and

22 WHEREAS, the appropriation of these monies is essential to the  
23 continued efforts of the Nation in narcotics enforcement  
24 during FY 1989 and further into the future.

25 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative  
26 Council that it requests that the United States Congress  
27 authorize supplemental appropriations in the amount of  
28 \$250,000.00 to support our Anti-Drug effort during FY  
29 '89.

30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council  
31 that it requests that the United States Congress return  
32 funding of our Anti-Drug efforts to its intended level  
of \$500,000.00 for FY '90.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council urges that the yearly allocation for narcotics enforcement, investigation, interdiction and eradication be made a permanent part of the Law Enforcement base funding and a part of the P. L. 93-638 contract.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 10th. day of February, 1989 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,340.5 for; -0- against; 58.5 not voting; and 241.0 absent, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (c), (2), & (f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).


